1 Introduction

Avoid bla bla introductions, or repetition of well-known equations, such as the standard Navier-Stokes equations. Do not include an abstract.

2 L^AT_EX class

Make sure that the *nutts.cls* file is in the directory of your article. If you wish to use figures with *.png*, *.jpg*, or *.pdf* formats, then compile with *pdflatex* instead of *latex*.

3 Contents

Extended abstracts should be limited to 6 pages in A4 format with 2.5 cm margin. Keep the main text in 11 pt Times new roman. In the title, the authors are given in 11pt bold font, their affiliations in 11pt standard font. If there is only one affiliation, omit the *, †, ‡, § etc. Academic titles and page numbers shall be omitted.

Give references by name and year, such as Cool et al. (2003), Hot (2013), or Hot and Cold (2014). This choice is made to stay consistent with the Word style, where numerical references are hard to generate. Keep references to the essential.

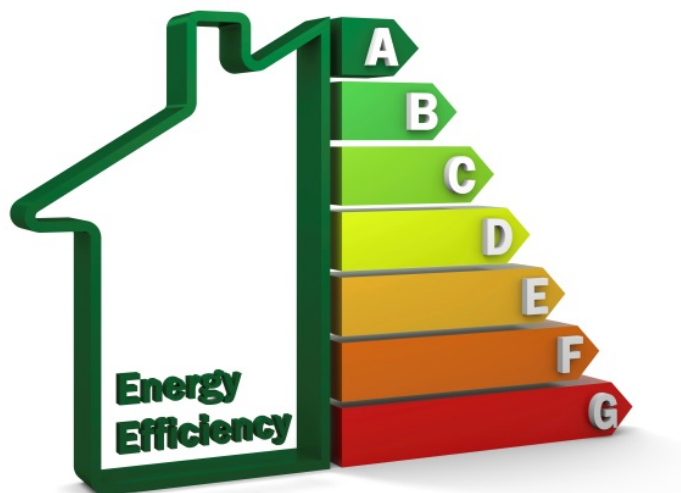


Fig. 1: This is the caption of the figure.

Figures can be included in the standard *figure* environment and are to be referenced as Fig. 1. An example of an equation is Eq. (1).

$$e^{i\pi} + 1 = 0. \quad (1)$$

Tables like Table 1 can be typeset as you like; there are no rules for the use of vertical lines, or not.

4 Section headings

You are not obliged to use section headings as the extended abstract can be one mega-chapter. If you wish to use sections, use a bold font of the standard 11pt size.

4.1 Subsection headers

Use subsections only if *absolutely* needed. Two levels max, do not use subsubsections or below. The font is the same as for the section headers.
